## SAFE & FAMILY FRIENDLY

**I**t's a pedestrian town, enhanced by the compact, one-mile square residential and business district. Everyone walks to summer concerts at Vine Street Park and the Fourth of July celebration at Ross Park. Many regularly stroll the streets for exercise and the chance to visit neighbors along the way.

**T**he city's 16-officer police force visibly serves and protects residents and businesses. Crime

prevention reaches all ages from a simple preschooler story to teaching conflict resolution in high school and a strong neighborhood watch program.

**S**t. Bernard claims one of the area's oldest full-time fire departments, manned by 25 firefighters and a highly trained paramedic team. Response time anywhere in the city is less than two minutes.

## SERVICE WITH A SMILE

**S**t. Bernard's charm is its small-town appeal, but that simplicity masks an elaborate system of city services. *Community Safe™*, a programmable message system, is used to keep residents informed about community events, or should the need arise, safety concerns.

**T**he Dial-A-Ride bus system transports residents anywhere within the city limits for a nominal fee.

**T**rash pickup twice weekly is local policy. Residents may request a city truck for large items, or for special projects, dumpsters may be placed. Many residents opt to purchase heavy duty trash bags at city hall to aid in keeping St. Bernard a clean and welcoming city.

**R**esidents may reserve one of the city's three banquet halls or one of four park shelters for a family gathering.

## WORK HARD-PLAY HARDER

**C**ity services cater to *all* age groups. Seven parks include state-of-the-art toddler lots, three athletic fields and an Olympic-sized pool complex. A city swim team, sand volleyball, tee-ball, softball, kickball, soccer and summer-crafts programs keep children busy year round. Residents 16 years and over may use the municipal building's fitness center for a small monthly fee. Card clubs, a senior citizens' club, woman's club and water aerobics entertain residents as well.
