

St. Bernard Residents Recycled 386 Tons in 2017

Congratulations St. Bernard residents! In 2017, we recycled **385.79 tons** of metal, glass, plastic and paper. Residents saved resources, conserved energy, and reduced pollution by recycling.

The recycling efforts in St. Bernard:

- Conserved enough energy to power every home in St. Bernard for two weeks.
- Reduced more air pollution than if every household in St. Bernard rode their bicycle to work for two months.
- Saved 3,136 trees from being harvested.

On average, each household in St. Bernard recycled 373 pounds in 2017. That's 14.24% of all the waste we generate.
